# Young Artist Mentoring Program - 16 years and going strong:

Founded in 2004, The Young Artist Mentoring Program is one of Morris Arts' longest running and most successful programs. The program is a weekly after school program involving some of Morristown High School's most artistically talented students who need additional support in refining their artistic skills, developing their own personal style, and assembling a strong art portfolio, enhancing their ability to compete for admission into quality arts schools, college, a career in visual arts and/or scholarship aid.

Serving 106 students since its inception, the program also enables these young artists realize the potential impact they can have on their communities as future business and artistic leaders. Two professional artists, Susan Faiola and Mike Moran, met with students for twenty weeks to provide mentoring/oversight, offer creative criticism and help the students create art portfolios for college or art school applications.

During the 2019-2020 school year, YAMP served eight students, with the two seniors in the program accepted by the Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers and County College of Morris for illustration and animation respectively. During the first half of the year, the students worked on a collaborative illustrated book called The Tangerine Tree, a collection of stories in comic form, sketchbook pages, and various pieces of artwork. The students voted on a title and a theme and worked together to develop a storyline and characters. When they are able to finish the project, the book will be published on KDP, previously called Amazon Create Space. Both mentoring teachers are professional illustrators and will guide the students in the bookmaking process. The teachers hope that the students will be inspired and proud when seeing their book in print and the books will serve as a highlight of their college portfolios.

Morristown High School closed in the Spring due to COVID-19 and the students finished out the mentoring program through virtual learning. Long-time Morris Arts teaching artist, initial and former YAMP teacher (for 14 years), Dan Fenelon connected with students and created how-to lessons for the students. Dan's video lessons covered topics such as portfolio development, 3D printing and how to prepare for a college or job interview. The video lessons greatly helped the students continue progressing through the YAMP curriculum.

# Girls Surviving, renamed Her Words, offers virtual program for summer 2020

A writing and performance program for teen girls and gender nonconforming youth based in Morristown, New Jersey, *Her Words* (formerly *Girls Surviving*), enables teen girls and gender nonconforming youth to write about issues relevant to their lives. Girls and gender nonconforming youth in grades 8-12 are welcome to join our program free of charge. The program is open to youth in Morristown, and surrounding areas.

Under normal circumstances, the teens meet weekly at Morristown High School, in Morristown to share experiences and write creatively, crafting narrative, poetry, and fiction as well as monologues and scenes for a play. At the end of each academic year, the teens perform their work for family, friends, and community members. They also publish their writings in a book and perform readings of their work in the community and on Soundcloud.

Because the program is free, fluid and varied, youth who might otherwise not have an opportunity to participate in such an extensive arts program discover their talents, learn new skills, and become more flexible in dealing with life's demands. In essence, they learn to improvise, both on and off the stage, honing their writing and performing skills and developing into leaders. Longtime members have become paid interns in the summer program, responsible for leading exercises and group discussions. Those who stay in the program year after year respond to the opportunities offered to them as well as the excitement and challenge of expressing themselves artistically in a relaxed and positive setting.

Due to pandemic constraints, the 2020 Summer Program was held on Zoom\* from July 7 to August 13, 2020, on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10 to 11:30 a.m. Visiting teaching artists led workshops in creative writing, arts, and performance – including spoken word poetry, comics, visual storytelling, zinemaking and self-publishing, flash memoir and storytelling, social activism and zentangle. Visiting teaching artists include Madeline Court, May Lee-Yang, Summer Pierre, Glenda Reed, Alyse Royal (Ally Are), Bella Simon, Mimi Topping, and Mariam Williams. Together they created work that elevated teen voices and experiences, culminating in a published book and special performance of their work for family and community members on August 13.

# **Teaching Artist Summer Series**

On July 16th, Morris Arts presented the first of multiple programs within The Teaching Artist Summer Series, a free

series of professional learning opportunities for teaching artists who work in the state of New Jersey initiated by Young Audiences Arts for Learning NJ & Eastern PA (YA) and the New Jersey Arts Education Collective (Collective).

Topics ranged from the development of practical tools and skills, using technology to enhance creativity and examining topics from jazz, poetry, the natural world to curriculum mining and racism within a virtual setting. Participants were welcome to register for any number of events. Video playback was sent to each of the registrants at the conclusion of the workshop and will be made available for a limited time to registrants who could not attend the live experience.

# **Art Imitates Life Imitates Art:** Morris Arts' Masterpiece Challenge

An artistic response to quarantine times? Morris Arts had a creative answer. In May and June, Morris Arts took a cue from the Getty Museum and other world class art institutions around the world, launching its own "masterpiece challenge," encouraging those with an artistic flair to recreate and/or reinterpret famous works of art on Facebook and Instagram. The first challenge was judged by artist Anne Mitchell and focused on interpretations of famous figurative paintings. The second challenge focused on interpretations of famous abstract paintings and was judged by Danielle Merzatta who graciously donated a gift card for Merzatta, an art/jewelry store in Morristown.
