#### Girls Surviving Workshop

Teachers, Teaching Artists, Guidance Counselors, Psychologists, Community Program Leaders attended the free introductory workshop on May 17th to learn about Girls Surviving, a student-centered program in writing and performance for adolescent girls with a proven history of changing teen girls' lives. The workshop covered activities that motivate girls to take the lead in conversations between teens and between teens and adults, exercises that encourage collaboration and allow teens the freedom to express themselves without feeling judged and acting games that give teens the perspective to transform their life experiences into theatre. Experienced teaching artists Paula Davidoff, a storyteller, and Carolyn Hunt, a playwright and director, who created Girls Surviving in 2005, described their unique strategies to encourage teens to talk through their concerns, raise their voices about the important issues in their lives and take the lead in developing performances that reflect their insights about teen life. Paula and Carolyn have also authored a book about their work entitled Girls Surviving: Teaching Teen Girls to Speak Out.


# Morris Arts recognizes individuals and organizations at CELEBRATE THE ARTS

On Friday, March 27, 2015, over 450 young artists, their teachers, family and friends, along with the general public attended the Opening Reception of the 28th annual Blackwell Street Juried Student Exhibit at the Atrium Gallery. Reflecting the exceptional creativity, skill and passion of these young artists - drawn from over 20 high schools in Morris County and beyond, the nearly 370 artworks on display were juried by professional artists from the Blackwell Street Center for the Arts which also organized, installed and administered the show, awarding ribbons and prizes in a reception ceremony.

#### Morris Arts one of 18 Local Arts Agencies in the nation to win NEA grant for public art

Morris Arts was thrilled to win a \$20,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts for its Our Heritage is Our Future, The Gateway Totem Project. Stone carver and sculptor Gabriele Hiltl-Cohen will create a new, site-specific public art installation in the historic Speedwell section of Morristown. Morris Arts is collaborating with the Town of Morristown to implement a part of the town's master plan by commissioning this new public artwork, partially funded by Morristown's recently enacted Percentage for Art initiative. The installation will serve as the centerpiece of a community park in an area identified by the town as needing redevelopment. The two carved stone pillars will feature symbols and poetry reflecting community input and paying homage to the many immigrant communities who have called this neighborhood home over the centuries (Italian, Irish, Jewish, African American, Latino, etc.). Public workshops and the design of a sculpture and gathering space in front of Grow it Green Morristown's community garden will create a focal point that honors past, present and future residents and help unite the community while fostering cross-cultural understanding and acceptance. "Morris Arts is thrilled to be in such select company," commented Executive Director Tom Werder. "This grant constitutes national recognition for our public art initiatives to build community through the arts. We are extremely grateful to have NEA support for this project."

# From Polka to Tahitian Dance at Music Beyond Borders 2016

You don't have to buy a plane ticket to enjoy music and dance from around the world. It's all coming to the Morristown Green! Initiated in 2010, this series of free outdoor world music/dance performances, reflects a collaboration between Morris Arts and Mayo Performing Arts Center (with the rainsite graciously provided by Morristown United Methodist Church - 50 Park Place on the Green). Now in its seventh season, Music Beyond Borders continues to tap into the cultural riches from multiple continents and, this year, will present the following:



June 28, 2016: Smitty's Polka Band Trio - Key into the high energy and fun of Smitty's Polka Band! Featuring the renowned accordionist/lead singer "Papa Bavarian," Smitty's has performed at major events and venues throughout the metropolitan area, including the Circle Line Bear Mountain cruise, top corporate and community Oktoberfests and even Derek Jeter's retirement party! Bring your dancing shoes and join the fun!

July 12, 2016: Indian Ragas and Rhythms, with Shivalik Ghoshal on Tabla and Vocalist/Harmonium player Andrew **Shantz** - Take a sonic trip to the intricate and compelling world of classical Indian music with these two award-winning

virtuoso performers from the Brooklyn Raga Massive. Shivalik's tabla playing was featured on the soundtrack of Born into Brothels, and he is currently working on re-orchestrating music for two Chicago productions of *The Jungle* Book. A multi-talented musician with





jazz background, Andrew has trained in India and immersed himself in Hindustani-North Indian-classical music as a vocalist and harmonium player. One can only marvel at their complex improvisations and intricate rhythmic/melodic interactions.



July 26, 2016: Mexico Beyond Mariachi - An "exuberant feast for the senses," Mexico Beyond Mariachi explores the long history of diverse regions of Mexico, the rituals, myths, and celebrations with colorful costumes, authentic instruments, and lively music and dance. With drums, flutes, conch shells and

dances of the pre-Hispanic through the modern eras, they have performed for over one million people across the world - including 30 recent performances at the New York Botanical Garden's Rose Hall for the blockbuster Frida Kahlo Exhibit. Don't miss this fascinating and enlightening performance.

August 9, 2016: Lei Pasifika - Tahitian and Hawaiian Dance from the Pacific - A performance group focused on preserving and sharing the music, dances and cultural heritage of Polynesia, (primarily Tahiti and Hawaii), Lei Pasifika's performances take audiences on a magical voyage through the legends and history of Polynesian culture. Led by founder

Makalina Gallagher, (who was born and raised in and around the Pacific Islands), the dancers have appeared in multiple Asian Pacific Festivals throughout Manhattan and Brooklyn, in film promotions, on numerous TV shows and even at Bette Midler's 4th Annual Hulaween Ball.
