



Visual Arts Bloom this Spring with Morris Arts exhibits

The Gallery at 14 Maple:

The current exhibit, Seeing Space, ends on March 21st, and will be succeeded by Capturing Nature, the 12th exhibit at the Gallery at 14 Maple and the second "invitational" exhibit. Highlighting the theme **Capturing Nature** through works by two outstanding and unique New Jersey artists, Joseph Losavio and Natalia Margulis, the new exhibit officially opens on April 3, 2014 and will run through August 27th. Losavio's works utilize a variety of media including oil, collage, and handmade papers. He often combines multiple landscapes within one work and creates scenes which have a mystical, haunting and highly poetic quality evocative of ancient Sufi poetry. Margulis' works demonstrate her astonishing abilities with the textile medium. Combining hand dyed threads, complex stitchwork and three dimensional components, she conveys highly detailed, intricately textured works which have an immediate visceral effect on the viewer, captivating and intriguing the eye and mind on multiple levels. The public is invited to the free opening reception on April 3, from 6-8pm at the Gallery at 14 Maple, located on the 3rd floor of the LEED certified building at 14 Maple Ave., Morristown.

Following the Art in the Atrium's current exhibit of African American art, *Your Crown Has Been Bought and Paid For,* which highlights works by distinguished artist James Denmark as well as works by over 30 others (through March 19), the **Blackwell Street Juried Student Exhibit** will have its **opening reception, March 28th from 6:30-9pm.** Featuring the top 350+ student works, culled from nearly 700 submissions, this show is one of the highlights of the year, throwing a spotlight on some extraordinary young talents within our county. The reception is free and open to the public – with free parking available in the garage below the building (enter on Schuyler Place). The exhibit will run through April 29, 2014.

Following the Juried Student Exhibit, the Atrium Gallery will host an **opening reception on April 16th,** from 6:30-9pm, for its **Spring/Summer 2014 Exhibit** which will run through September 3, 2014 and showcase works by artist members of the Blackwell Street Center for the Arts, the Art Association in Roxbury, the Myhelan Artists Network and the Contemporary Art Group.

Local Arts Grant Writing Workshop for funding year 2015

The Local Arts Grants, administered in Morris County by Morris Arts, provides funding to local arts organizations from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts/Department of State, a Partner Agency of the National Endowment for the Arts. The program offers grants for general operating support and for special projects to qualifying Morris County arts organizations, as well as non-profit organizations that provide arts programming. Applications are reviewed by an independent panel and funding awarded on a yearly basis.

We invite Morris County nonprofit arts organizations and Morris County nonprofits with arts programming that wish to apply for Local Arts Grants from Morris Arts to join us for our upcoming, free Local Arts Grant Writing Workshops on Wednesday, May 21, 2014 for funding year 2015.
