Designed to fill the need in Morris County for a location for artists to exhibit their work, the gallery offers four floors of atrium and lobby space for exhibition in the County of Morris Administration and Records Building located on Court Street in Morristown.

The exhibitions have been viewed by thousands of residents. Indicative of the support the Gallery has received from artists in Morris County and throughout New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania, is the long list of advance bookings and ongoing requests to exhibit.

The Art Gallery started in 1977 in a small waiting room in the former County Administration Building, now the Courthouse Annex. In this room, the Morris County Heritage Commission held numerous small exhibitions of paintings, prints and photographs by well-known New Jersey artists. The Heritage Commission continues to contribute artwork to the Atrium Art Gallery.

In January 2008, at the request of the County, Morris Arts assumed oversight for planning exhibitions at the Atrium Gallery.

As you walk through the corridors viewing the artwork, the Board of County Commissioners is certain you will enjoy the exhibition and be enriched by its contents.

SHOSHANA KERTESZ Artist's Statement / Bio:

Shoshana Kertesz was born in Budapest, Hungary. She wanted to be a painter since age four. Based on her artistic talent, she was placed in an elementary school class that had special art education for the gifted. She studied Visual Arts at the Montazs Art School in Budapest for four years. Her teachers were Jozsef Baska and Katalin Renyi. In 2003 Shoshana left Hungary and moved to Jerusalem, Israel. She continued to exhibit her artwork throughout Hungary and Israel. The works from this period show an orientation toward Biblical subjects.

Her figurative oil paintings have a range of different styles and subjects. Her realistic portrait series depict great artists, writers, poets and musicians that inspire her. Her "TIME" series explores the relationship between time and people. Is it our friend or our enemy? How does time affect people? Is the end a new beginning? Is time linear? Is it universal or personal? Her Calvary and Shifting Faces series express deep emotional and psychological states.

Shoshana Kertesz immigrated to the United States in 2010 and currently lives in New Jersey. She has had many opportunities to show her work throughout the United States, including the Contemporary Art Fair at the Javits Center, Gelabert Studio Gallery, Emerge Gallery, and the Fred Torres Gallery. She is a member of Studio Montclair and the West Orange Arts Council. Her paintings and photographs were published in numerous magazines, such as the *String Magazine, Nimrod Journal* and the *Foliate Oak Literary Journal*.

Black Revival! A Celebration of Black Fine Art is opening on May 13, 2022 and curated by Lauren LeBeaux Craig. **Black Revival!** will represent the first Art in the Atrium exhibit to take place back in our home gallery, the Atrium Gallery, Morristown, since March 2020. **Black Revival!** seeks to demonstrate that, despite the unsteadiness of the current world, Black talent, Black culture and Black brilliance has never wavered. A celebration of the emergence of the future, this exhibit will pay homage to our ancestor and ATA Founder, Victoria Craig, who will have a permanent plaque dedicated in the gallery space at the Artist's Reception on Thursday, June 16 (Juneteenth weekend). As an artist, educator, community leader and curator of Black fine art, Viki was the driving force behind ATA as a consistent platform for Black artists to shine.
