The Heritage Commission continues to contribute artwork to the Atrium Art Gallery.

In January 2008, at the request of the County, Morris Arts assumed oversight for planning exhibitions at the Atrium Gallery.

BIO / ARTIST STATEMENT:

Allan Gorman's artwork takes the viewer on a journey into the unusual shapes and tensions created by light and shadow plays on industrial and architectural structures. The influences of early 20th Century artists and photographers like Sloane, Bellows, Hopper, Sheeler, Paul Strand, and many others—who captured the emotional magic of industry, streets, and architecture of Gorman's native New York City—become redefined with a unique 21st Century voice in the artist's work.

Gorman's artworks have been exhibited in several important museums throughout the United States and Europe, including The Arnot Museum, Springfield Museum of Art, Lyman Allyn Art Museum, Albany Museum of Art, Daytona Museum of Arts and Sciences, MEAM Museum in Barcelona, Spain, Biardi Palace in Chiavasso, Italy, and the State Museum of New Jersey; and in commercial galleries, including Anthony Brunelli Fine Arts, Rehs Contemporary, Garvey|Simon NY, Nicole Longnecker Gallery, and CK Contemporary in San Francisco.

The artist is a two-time recipient of The New Jersey State Council on the Arts Fellowship for Painting; resident fellowships at the Vermont Studio Center and ESKFF at Mana Contemporary; Architectural Artist of the Year from ADC's Art Comes Alive!, the John Collins Award for Oil Painting and the Salmagundi Award from the American Artist's Professional League, and the Pioneer of Realism award from the International Guild of Realism.

Gorman lives in West Orange and maintains a studio at Mana Contemporary in Jersey City.

LISA LACKEY

ARTIST STATEMENT:

I love to discover and recreate the striking compositions that surround me: Scenes from my everyday experience that speak to me visually while resonating with me emotionally. Sewing since I was eight, I find the best way to express myself is by translating these images into fiber collages using fabric, paper, needle, and thread. I want to recreate the observed image to feel it again, not just see it. Rebuilding a composition piece by piece submerges me back into the space of that second in time and allows me to relive it in a way a photograph doesn't permit. Joining these materials to each other brings my world back into focus and makes the fleeting moment tactile once more. From a distance, my work reads as a painting, print or even a photograph. It is only with closer inspection that the work's true construction reveals itself, giving the viewer more and more to visually explore and discover.

BIO:

Lisa Lackey is a Maplewood-based fiber artist who curates her imagery from contemporary scenes she witnesses which intersect with her emotional inner dialogue. Rendering these compositions in fabric, paper, and thread, or a combination thereof, her images of everyday life resound with symbolic meaning. Lisa hones her wide base of knowledge in architecture, graphic art, and sewing techniques to give her collages a bold, unique confluence of perspective, light, shadow, and color.

Lisa's work has shown various venues in New Jersey, including Art Fair 14C, the Monmouth Museum, the Long Beach Island Foundation for Arts + Science, and currently in at the New Jersey Arts Annual show, Emergence, at the New Jersey State Museum in Trenton. In New York City her work has been seen at The Painting Center, Westbeth Gallery, and at the Garrison Arts Center in upstate New York, and Saatchi's The Other Art Fair. Her work has traveled to the d'Art Center in Norfolk, VA as well as the Korea Bojagi Forum in the Suwon I Park Museum of Art, in Suwon, South Korea and the Chojun Textile & Quilt Art Museum in Seoul. Maplewood Township has permanently mounted one of her pieces, Maplewood's Grace, at the Maplewood Train Station.

She has authored two books about her work: The Composition of Family, a collection of her sketches, and Everyday Beauty, a series of thirty-two paper collages, respectively.

Holding Bachelor's degrees in both Architectural Engineering and Environmental Design from the University of Kansas, as well as a Master of Fine Arts, from the School of Visual Arts in New York City. Lisa's interests have taken her into architectural lighting design; costume draping; co-owner and designer of a women's clothing company; and lastly, as a 7-12 Art and Math teacher in the New York City Public School System before giving her the chance to work full time in a studio of her own, recreating her world in fabric, paper, and thread.

MARK DE MOS ARTIST STATEMENT:

Artist Statement: My goal, as an artist is to produce art that is alive, not static and that creates a drama(color or story), a feeling, a slice of life. I also believe in taking advantage of the medium's strength. In watercolor, it's the fluidity, soft varying washes that can also, by color selection, create interesting textures (granulation) and edge control(soft, hard and lost). My goal is to create art work that isn't technique driven, but captures the essence of a given subject. Instead of a having a finished idea in mind that I just put down, I use a reactive process that focuses on a subject or idea that intrigues me which has an interesting value pattern. As I paint I react to what's on the paper and I can see the interesting color and tonal elements that will make it come to life. I believe it is the attention to color and the use of under painting that defines my work. I apply colors in warm and cool variants and "bounce" nearby or complementary colors into shadows and highlights to imply the movement of light.

Mark has exhibited in shows and galleries throughout the Eastern seaboard. His works have been featured at the following Galleries:

BIO:

Kevin R. Burkitt is a project photographer who often spends years working on particular topics, ideas, and concepts, focusing on defining events and their impacts in and around New Jersey. Kevin's works are intrinsically passion-driven while extrinsically motivated by the man-made response to natural events. Ironically, Kevin chose not to document COVID, social unrest, or political instability, taking time away from photography by opting to go camping, kayaking, and hammocking for the foreseeable future.

Professionally, Kevin works at Rutgers University as an Instructional Technologist and is pursuing a second master's degree in Instructional Design at Quinnipiac University.

ARTIST STATEMENT:

91 Days: Countless Nights is an eight-year exploratory photographic documentary that catalogs the destruction caused by Superstorm Sandy from 2013 through 2021. The works have never been seen in their entirety, but some have been displayed at Morris Arts, Brookdale Community College, and Princeton University. The rights and ownership of this project have been turned over to Rutgers University. They are part of their digital art collection, which can and will be used for academic purposes for students, faculty, and future national reference.

This project was inspired by the dark concept album *Lateralus* by the progressive metal band, *Tool*. All images were timed to three songs deep within the experience, *Lateralus*, *Reflection*, and *Disposition*, and all images were taken from 9:00 pm to 4:00 am. Each image is a single take and exposure ranging from 08:32 to 10:44 minutes. The image sequence and location were random and ranged from Union Beach to Lavallette, New Jersey. Image Details:

- The images are printed on 12X18 metallic paper
- The images do not have names or describers and are to remain anonymous
- · One Image is 36 X 40

DAVID CLAIR BIO:

David Clair is largely self-taught and has been painting as a hobby since the early 1960's. He started working in oils but switched to acrylics in the mid 70's. Over the years, he has experimented with a variety of acrylic, collage and mixed media techniques. He has had one-man shows at the Bernardsville Library and his works have appeared in exhibits at Morris Arts, the Mountain Art Show, the Somerset Art Association and the Tewskbury Historical Society.

A chemical engineering graduate of the University of Colorado, he worked thirty-three years for Exxon Corporation (Exxon/Mobil). He lived in Brussels, Belgium for several years while President of Essochem Europe and travelled extensively throughout Europe during that time. He and his wife, Dorothy (also an artist), returned to Europe frequently, often to Italy, for which they have a special affection. These travels have often provided an inspiration for his work.

He moved to New Jersey from Europe in 1985 and served as President of Exxon Research and Engineering and, subsequently, as Executive Vice President of Exxon International until his retirement in 1990.

ARTIST STATEMENT:

Because of the theme of this show, many of my pieces here contain landscape elements. They include a series where two or three dimensional, geometric forms are the frame or platform for the scene they contain. This provides tension between the man-made rigidity of the frame and the nature-based scene inside. The framework is done in acrylics and the scenes are some combination of acrylics and collage. The collage elements in this series and in many of the other landscapes in the show are generally magazine papers used directly or with varying degrees of solvent treatment. Using lacquer thinner the printed image can be faded or completely destroyed and the inks quickly worked into the desired texture. In turn, the resulting textures are useful in representing rock formations and foliage in landscapes as well as other textural effects for more abstract work. Not all magazines use inks that will dissolve properly but older *National Geographics* were ideal and with experience, I learned what starting images, colors, and subsequent manipulations would produce the colors and textures I was after.
