Designed to fill the need in Morris County for a location for artists to exhibit their work, the gallery offers four floors of atrium and lobby space for exhibition in the County of Morris Administration and Records Building located on Court Street in Morristown.

The exhibitions have been viewed by thousands of residents. Indicative of the support the Gallery has received from artists in Morris County and throughout New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania, is the long list of advance bookings and ongoing requests to exhibit.

The Art Gallery started in 1977 in a small waiting room in the former County Administration Building, now the Courthouse Annex. In this room, the Morris County Heritage Commission held numerous small exhibitions of paintings, prints and photographs by well-known New Jersey artists. The Heritage Commission continues to contribute artwork to the Atrium Art Gallery.

In January 2008, at the request of the County, Morris Arts assumed oversight for planning exhibitions at the Atrium Gallery.

As you walk through the corridors viewing the artwork, the Board of County Commissioners is certain you will enjoy the exhibition and be enriched by its contents.

LISA B. CERNY ARTIST STATEMENT:

My work represents my perception of my world at this point in time. To me, art is a form of healing that looks beyond the person to the magic, healing energy, and hope found in nature. The trees, sky, landscapes, flowers, fairies, palettes, even the foils and sparkle are there for grounding, magic, wonder, a safe space to get lost in, and a source of peace. The intention of my art is that the viewer experiences strength, hope, magic, surprise, and resilience.

ABOUT LISA:

Lisa is a collage artist from Morristown, New Jersey who uses handmade papers, fabrics, trims, flowers, metals, stones, magazines, acrylics, found objects, and gels to raise the surface into three-dimensional collage art. Her mixed media art has a soulful, whimsical, and magical quality, Lisa's inspiration comes from chance encounters with others, her flower garden, the night sky, bodies of water, metals, nature, stones, crystals, butterflies, and fairies. Her little studio is full of flowers, twinkling lights, colorful papers, fabrics, ribbon, and trim. As a nurse and an artist, Lisa sees all forms of art as healing and that is what she hopes comes through in her work. Her materials vary according to the piece, the inspiration, and the techniques involved. She is a lifelong learner and continuously experiments with new tools and techniques.

As a nurse and artist, I view all forms of art as a means healing. I hope my art strength, hope, magic, surprise, and resilience. When I am dissatisfied with my work, walking through my house reviewing previous work helps me stay true to my artistic vision and style. Last December, I put my career as an adjunct nursing professor on hold in order to pursue my art and to be open to wherever this new adventure takes me.

BIO/ARTIST STATEMENT:

Amy Whitman (b. Hanover, PA, 1963) is a self-taught artist who primarily focuses on contemporary figurative work. After early careers as a kindergarten teacher, pediatric therapist, and raising her family, she is now devoted to her art full time.

Amy's work has been shown in juried exhibitions and art fairs primarily in the northeast and New York City. Her award winning work has been featured in art publications and various other media. Her first solo show, *Figure, Fashion & Fame*, premiered at Dacia Gallery in New York City during Fashion Week in 2019. Amy lives and works in Madison, New Jersey.

"I am enamored with the human figure and portraiture and the endless possibilities of the subject. I love exploring ways to give traditional representations a modern, whimsical twist. I work with pen and ink and paint to create images full of color and detail. Much of my work includes grand expressions of fashion, which I have always loved. I am drawn to the fantasy and aesthetic of garments, headpieces and accessories and the patterns of textiles used in couture. I let my mind wander through the possibilities of color and patterns and how they will play together with natural elements. My subjects vary from historical figures to self-invented characters to representations of actual friends and family. DIANE ENGLISH

Biography:

Please join Diane English on this journey to share her unique perspective. She considers herself to be an abstractionist and a colorist, with unique characteristics as her work lends itself to unintentional images and visual interest. Diane is an emerging artist, who enjoys creating in several mediums but has taken a leading role in creating in alcohol inks. This little-known medium consists of highly pigmented dyes with an alcohol component. She admits to being drawn to the vibrancy of the inks and the way it dries with a glossy sheen. Diane English's accomplished skills in alcohol ink techniques has garnered attention from private collectors and galleries.

ARTIST STATEMENT:

The back story for my introduction to alcohol inks began with seeing a group of ladies using inks to make jewelry. This sparked my interest and imagination because the inks came in vibrant colors and dried with a sheen reminiscent of photos. Alcohol inks allow me an opportunity to create my own dialogue, as I am an abstractionist and colorist by nature. I have worked with other mediums but the inks speak to me. Alcohol Ink is comprised of highly pigmented dyes and alcohol, which can be activated with alcohol and/or a blending solution. This ink can be used on any non-porous surface i.e., glass, tiles and metals although my substrate of choice is Yupo Paper which is made from recycled plastic materials and made into polypropylene sheets. This medium is relatively new on the art scene, it was originally used in scrapbooking and crafts, but is now used to create fine art. The inks move and blossom in ways that reject restrictions, it lends itself to unintentional images that stir the imagination. My works are organic with the beauty of the process being each piece is unique and cannot be duplicated. My process starts without a particular end in mind, and it's cultivated until I feel it's complete. I think mastering the medium requires challenging oneself to find new ways to manipulate the ink.

BIO

The crudely bizarre works of artist Hank Yaghooti use esotericism, symbolism and figuration to provoke thought, stimulate emotion, and encourage reflection. A polyrhythmic fusion of acrylic, watercolor, ink and spray paint, Yaghooti's mixed-media works are composed to visualize a parallel reality but with a more dark and expressive tone. His work alters the ordinary, to the extraordinary.

In Yaghooti's world of the extraordinary, the viewer is shown glimpses into an otherworldly reality. Familiarly human, but nothing short of peculiar and fragmented. Within the artist's personal perspective, visual stories of this reality are experiences of a much different life drama. Through the multilayered narrative, the viewer walks within the subconscious of their mindscape.

A graduate from New Jersey City University (BFA), Yaghooti's artistic collection of introspective expressionism has been on display in galleries and art events, including the Jersey City Art Studio Tour and Artworks in Trenton, NJ. His work has been featured in magazines, books and online galleries, including Beautiful Bizarre. He has two self-published books, "Black Lines In A White World" (2008) and "Chameleon" (2015), which are showcases of his drawings and paintings respectively. His work is included in several private collections and is also available through his personal website.

XIOMÁRO

OVERVIEW: Xiomáro (SEE-oh-MAH-ro) is an internationally exhibited artist and curator from New York specializing in photographing National Parks and other iconic sites to raise public awareness of their history, culture, and natural beauty. His street photography artistically documents what he refers to as "future history."

His work is widely exhibited – at one point in eight simultaneous exhibitions from Boston to Philadelphia - and his work has been exhibited or covered by media in Scotland, Italy, England, and Greece. As Visiting Artist at Weir Farm since 2012, Xio authored *Weir Farm National Historic Site*, a book featuring his photos of Connecticut's first national park (commemorated on the 2020 US quarter), including a foreword by Senator Joseph Lieberman. As a speaker and teacher, Xio reaches thousands of artists, historians, educators, students and environmentalists, presenting talks, lectures, panel discussions and social media workshops at museums, galleries, conferences, universities, camera/photography clubs, and high schools across the globe, including England, Myanmar and Australia.

Covered by *The New York Times, The Boston Globe, CBS Eyewitness News, PBS, ABC News, News 12, Newsday, Fox Nation, The Huffington Post,* and *Fine Art Connoisseur*, his work was also featured in a short documentary produced by the National Park Service, the Appalachian Mountain Club, and the Connecticut Forest and Park Association.

Exhibitions/ Commissions

Thousands of art lovers have seen Xio's photography at venues such as Fraunces Tavern Museum, African Burial Ground National Monument, Siena Art Institute (Italy) and at Congressional offices.

Many institutions, including Fruitland's Museum, Brigham Young University, the National Park Service, fine art galleries, libraries and historical societies, have acquired Xio's prints for their permanent collections.

Additionally, his images have appeared in internationally distributed catalogues, books, and journals and he has been commissioned for National Park Service projects at Sagamore Hill National Historic Site (President Theodore Roosevelt's Summer White House), Morristown National Historical Park (George Washington's headquarters, Jockey Hollow, Cross Estate Mansion), Frederick Law Olmsted National Historic Site (the first landscape architect office/creator of Central Park), Longfellow House Washington's Headquarters (Home of one of the world's foremost poets), William Floyd Estate (A signer of the Declaration of Independence), Weir Farm National Historic Site (The home/studios of Julian Alden Weir and Mahonri Young), Boston Harbor Islands National Recreation Area (Historic forts and abandoned army barracks), New England National Scenic Trail (A 215-mile hiking route in Connecticut and Massachusetts), Fire Island National Seashore (High Dune Wilderness and Salt Marsh), Big Cypress National Preserve (Invasive plants and animals), and Everglades National Park (Invasive plants).

A Little More About Me: People, Places, and Ideas

I am naturally curious and lots of subjects interest me. At first, I concentrated on photographing landscapes and the small, sometimes abstract, details within them...and evoking a mood or feeling in those compositions. Then I started taking the same approach to people in a way that projects who they really are or who they would like to be - all filtered through the way I see or know them.

Many historical figures are long deceased. But I can resurrect their spirits when I photograph their homes, workplaces, their material possessions, and the surrounding landscape. I am fortunate that the National Park Service (NPS) commissions me to apply my vision to sites once belonging to some of America's most notable VIPs ranging from political leaders like President Theodore Roosevelt and Founding Father William Floyd to creative minds like Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, Julian Alden Weir, and Mahonri Young. The NPS shares my view that these photographic collections will impact the culture to help stimulate curiosity about our open spaces and cultural/historical sites so that they will continue to be preserved and appreciated. This was particularly important when I was named one of their Centennial Artists-in-Residence in 2016.

Brooklyn Beginnings

These themes in my work have their beginnings in Brooklyn and Queens where I grew up surrounded by the arts and the artful. My uncle, a Van Gogh devotee, painted and introduced me to oils and watercolor. My father was a cabinet maker in the 18th and 19th century styles (e.g., Chippendale, Queen Anne, Sheraton, Empire, and Federal). He reproduced one-of-a-kind pieces for clients such as Chris Jussel who was later cast as the original host of PBS's Antiques Roadshow. Eventually, both parents became avid collectors and appreciators of the history represented by their acquisitions.

Every now and then, I worked at my father's shop and helped out with the planning, band sawing, sanding, gluing, and clamping. And, like many teenagers of the era, I started a basement band writing and playing original music. When I entered college, I majored in philosophy but took as many art and music courses as possible. Then, I graduated from New York University School of Law where I was the Editor-in-Chief of its *Journal of International Law and Politics*. After stints as a litigator at large corporate law firms, I became an arts-and-entertainment attorney and manager. I represented disco icons Village People, pop artist Lisa Lisa, rap artist MC Shan, and many other internationally-known talents, particularly in New York City's then-burgeoning Hip Hop and Dance music scenes.

You'll find me included in the books, *Managing Artists in Pop Music: What Every Artist and Manager Must Know to Succeed* (Allworth Press) by Mitch Weiss and Perri Gaffney as well as *I Don't Need a Record Deal: Your Survival Guide for the Indie Music Revolution* (Billboard Books) by Daylle Deanna Schwartz. That career also enabled me to observe top photographers at work such as Ellen von Unwerth, known for her Guess? Jeans advertising campaign with models Claudia Schiffer and Anna Nicole Smith.

Ready For Battle

With a busy life, finding time to keep up with my own creativity was a constant struggle. At one point, I managed to perform regularly at coffeehouses throughout the Northeast with a back-up band. Eventually, one of my songs spent a week in the Top 40 of *American Idol Underground*, their web version of the TV show.

I bought a small point-and-shoot camera to document these coffeehouse concerts. In time, I was drawn to photographing flowers, butterflies, and scenery and started exhibiting these decorative images at my shows. The prints often outsold my CDs - an indication that the camera could become another medium for artistic expression.

At the peak of this music phase, I was diagnosed with prostate cancer. The heightened sense of mortality provoked a gradual purging of the nonessentials that were cluttering my life. After my recovery, I found peace in the solitude of wandering the parks with my camera. I decided to start anew and develop a studio to pursue art seriously.

The change was commemorated by taking on a pseudonym - Xiomáro (SEE-oh-MAH-or). It's a nod to my family's roots in Spain and the Canary Islands off the coast of Africa. And Xiomáro literally means "ready for battle."



Xiomáro's Giant Portfolio – A show within Mystery, Memory & Magic

Instead of a small carrying case to show a representative selection of photography, why not use the walls of an entire floor exceeding 850,000 square feet in a prominent building?

Xiomáro's Giant Portfolio has the internationally exhibited artist reaching deep into his archives – dating from 2011 to 2022 – to present some of his more unusual and challenging images of historic architecture, landscapes, and artifacts commissioned by numerous iconic National Park sites. Included are selections from his personal work capturing the hallucinatory swirl of capitalism, colors, crowds, and characters of New York City and London street life and other moments from his travels.

The photographs depict the breadth and scope of Xiomáro's career. Some of the images are drawn from his most well-known exhibitions at Harvard University, African Burial Ground National Monument, and the Morris Museum. Others are drawn from his book, Weir Farm National Historic Site (Arcadia Publishing) with a foreword by Senator Joseph I. Lieberman. But many of the photographs on display represent previously unpublished work that was unable to be exhibited due to space and thematic constraints.

LYANNE MALAMED (1931 – 2022)

BIO/ARTIST STATEMENT:

Enigmatic and alluring, Lyanne Malamed's artwork is, in many ways, art "for the ages." Her depictions of children, brides, adults, and the elderly represent the entire cycle of human life, including death, with all its joys and sorrows. Inspired by historical art, Malamed invented her own visual vocabulary by repurposing traditional poses, garments, and symbolism in striking juxtapositions.

Her signature series depicting elderly women, often using real gold leaf, evokes Medieval and Early Renaissance times in a surrealistic manner. In Malamed's own words, her work "concerns the pain of these women who are outside of mainstream 'society' and attempts to describe the real dignity and power which is retained by these individuals while growing old in a hostile environment."

Lyanne Malamed was born in the small town of Alton, Iowa, and graduated from Briar Cliff College in Sioux City, before taking graduate courses in art at the University of Iowa. A professional artist since 1956, Malamed had over fifteen solo exhibitions and participated in twenty group shows. Her work is represented in numerous private and public collections including Bristol-Meyers Squibb, Johnson and Johnson, and Rider College.

Lyanne remained active in her artistic endeavors well into her eighties, exploring egg tempera as a new medium during that time.

She was persistent and unrelenting in her desire to show her work. Even as her health was declining, just prior to the Covid pandemic, she managed to produce a large solo exhibition. It was important to her that her life's work be shared with others after her death and she would be delighted to know that her work is on display in the Atrium Gallery.
